Legislation Report - Dec. 2018 Newsletter

S. 3021: America's Water Infrastructure Act of 2018

An Act to provide for improvements to the rivers and harbors of the United States, to provide for the conservation and development of water and related resources, to provide for water pollution control activities, and for other purposes. This bill was enacted after being signed by the President on October 23, 2018.

H.R. 6: SUPPORT for Patients and Communities Act

H.R. 6 includes Medicaid, Medicare, and public health reforms to combat the opioid crisis by advancing treatment and recovery initiatives, improving prevention, protecting communities, and bolstering efforts to combat illicit synthetic drugs like fentanyl. When a son or daughter died, a Gold Star was placed over the Blue Star to honor the person who had made the ultimate sacrifice for the country. In time their mothers became known as Gold Star Mother and their families were known as Gold Star Families.

Today there is an organization known as Gold Star Mothers which offers comfort and support to those who have lost sons or daughters. We too appreciate their sacrifice and the sacrifice of their loved ones in behalf of our great country.


